- 1. As the internet has evolved to transform the ways in which we access information and engage with various topics, it has led to the rise of a new audio format which, in recent years, has seen a huge surge in popularity. This modern medium is the podcast. Podcasts have revolutionised the way audio content is consumed on the internet, reaching over 546 million listeners worldwide. What makes podcasting superior to traditional audio formats such as the radio is its ease of access and control, listener-centric approach, and convenience.
- 2. Unlike the radio, podcasts are automatically delivered to your computer or smartphone once you subscribe to the Really Simple Syndication (RSS) feed of your favourite podcaster. The RSS feed acts as a standardised channel of content distribution which ensures that only the content authorised by the publisher is added to the feed, thus preventing the risk of spam and viruses. Through podcast aggregators such as Spotify or iTunes, each new show listed in the feed is automatically downloaded to your device as it becomes available. Podcasts also allow listeners to have complete control over their list of subscriptions, and simply unsubscribe if they no longer wish to receive the content added by a publisher to the feed.
- 3. Podcasts are primarily MPEG-1 Audio Layer-3 (MP3) audio files, which have a relatively small size and can thus be easily downloaded from the internet. The MP3 file format is instrumental in delivering the clear, steady audio of podcasts that is not only superior in quality to AM and FM radio, but also available for the listener whenever and wherever they like.
- 4. While traditional radio is a form of mass broadcasting that is characterised by advertising and generic programming, podcasts offer a personalised

listening experience that caters to the individual needs and interests of its audience. Essentially, podcasts are radio shows on demand, time-shifted to fit into the schedule of the listeners.

5. Podcasting has proved to be a game-changer in the world of audio content due to the high sound quality of MP3 encoding, the convenience of subscribing and downloading, and the portability of these files. Globally, an increasing number of podcasts are being produced, published, downloaded, and created every day. There are currently free shows available on topics ranging from the mainstream to the niche. Every day, seasoned experts, talented enthusiasts, and amateurs create new, exquisitely created content that is available for easy listening. If you have a hobby, an interest, or a curiosity about anything, chances are there is a podcast for you. (423 words)

- 1. A small village in Rajsamand district in Rajasthan, called Piplantri, has shown the world how social transformation can happen in the most unexpected of ways. The Piplantri Model has merged the goals of environmental sustainability and gender equality through its remarkable community initiative to plant 111 trees for every girl child born in the village. Once reduced to a barren and denuded land, Piplantri has increased its forest cover by more than 3 lakh trees since 2007.
- 2. Piplantri's transformation was spearheaded by Shyam Sunder Paliwal, the former sarpanch of the village. In the early 2000s, Piplantri faced a severe crisis engendered by industrialization, as the village was dominated by marble mines and quarries. The village lacked basic infrastructure and agriculture. Water levels fell below 800 feet and drinking water was scarce. Amidst these harsh conditions, Shri. Paliwal lost his 17-year-old daughter to dehydration in 2006. This tragic incident fueled his passion for transforming Piplantri, and upon her demise, he planted the first tree in memory of his daughter 'Kiran'. This moment was the seed of the revolution of Piplantri village.
- 3. Gradually, awareness grew in the village about the importance of planting trees to save water. The decision to plant 111 trees to celebrate the birth of a girl child came in 2007, and tackled the twin issues of declining gender ratios and deforestation in one fell swoop. As a result of collective action, water levels that were below 800 feet in Piplantri have risen up 15 feet to ground level in a span of 5 years. (252 words)




## Coffee sales on a weekday
